TNC and CTI-CFF



- Development partner since before inception in 2009; significant support to launch of the institution
- Indonesia, PNG and Solomon Islands programs for 25+ years
- Technical Working Groups e.g CTMPAS
- Gender
 - Provision of support to develop the gender policy for CTI-CFF through Women Leaders' Forum; essential for donor support
 - Links to our other gender related work across the region e.g. Nature's Leading Women
- Sustainable Finance
 - Support to establish regional frameworks and trust funds Micronesia and Caribbean
 - Previous discussions on trust fund options 2014-15
 - Debt restructure (ref Seychelles)
 - Reef insurance (ref Mexico)

TNC Indonesia Yayasan Konservasi Alam Nusantara



- **Sulu Sulawesi:** Blue carbon, CCA and DRR, MPA management improvements in East Kalimantan
- **Bismarck:** Livelihoods, customary governance for fisheries, and sustainable financing for conservation in Raja Ampat
- Lesser Sunda: Responsible seaweed aquaculture and market driven conservation in Savu Sea; interest in securing the cross boundary migratory routes of cetaceans with IKI funds
- Supporting the Government of Indonesia in improving fisheries database for harvest control of Indonesia Fisheries Management Areas (WPP)



TNC Solomon Islands



- Foundation: participatory Ridges to Reefs planning and management
 - Capacity building of tribal and provincial level government institutions
- Expand R2R to additional provinces with IKI funds
- KAWAKI: Women-led tourism in Arnavon Islands



TNC Papua New Guinea



- R2R at various scales
- USAID Biodiversity funds/Cardno
 - Madang
- Mangoro Market Meri
 - Support development of sustainable income streams e.g. mudcrab export, ecotourism, volunteer tourism
 - Mangrove nursery
 - Value chain analysis
- Manus sea cucumber
 - Working with tribal networks
 - Sustainable harvest levels
 - Direct access to market and premium prices in Hong Kong
